#### **GENERAL ORDER, NO. 1**

This short verse of scripture has held an important place in my life. I had long believed that working in the background, getting many little things done, was the way to improve the general existence. As I have aged, I have found the need for others to see the light and to make our presence known in the world. In Masonry, we are all seeking light, but we hide our candle beneath the proverbial bushel. In Templary, we also hide within our asylums, seemingly afraid to upset the sensitivities of the world. It is time for us to change that. Be proud of your Templary. Wear it proudly on your tie, on your lapel, on your polo shirt and your jacket. Let the world know of us, what we preach, what we do.

The light, or in my case specifically, the lantern is my symbol. Not only does it represent that throwing of light to the outward world, but the lantern has a more particular meaning for me masonically. In 1775, a young Sexton in the Old North Church one night crawled up into the belfry, darkened the windows on three sides and hung two lanterns for carefully watching eyes. One of those lanterns, we are told, resides in Concord, MA at the Concord Museum, also the hometown of my Mother Lodge. One of the sets of eyes waiting for the signal that the lanterns provided was our own M.W. Paul Revere, who chartered Corinthian Lodge in 1797. It was my great pleasure to have been Master of that Lodge in 1994-1995. To add to the circle, it is believed that the first sentinel of Boston Commandery No. 2 was that Sexton who put his life on the line for what he believed. I have been honored to be a Past Commander of that august institution.

## **GENERAL ORDER, NO. 3**

## **GENERAL ORDER, NO. 4**

Historic Uniforms

The cost of outfitting every Sir Knight in a class A uniform being more than many Sir Knights and various Commanderies can afford, It is ordered that , following the precedent of a Past Grand Commander regarding the Boston Commandery No.2 "Red Jacket Uniform", a Commandery may adopt a uniform sport coat and slacks, with white shirt and Commandery tie as a historic uniform for all Sir Knights not working on the floor, and the dark blue jacket and Commandery tie of Gethsemane-DeMolay Commandery is hereby approved as a historic uniform.
